Living in Tucson, Paniccia later moved for a time to Phoenix to be closer to his two lawyers there for his trial, and was interviewed there by the '*Phoenix New Times*' resulting in published news articles on 18 NOV 1992 and 12 AUG 1992. Tom Paniccia later committed suicide with an overdose of prescription pills on 23 JUL 2007 while living in Roseville, California unable to reconcile his feelings between his Presbyterian church and being Gay beliefs according to his letter left on the dash board of his car where he was found [*The Sacramento Bee* article published 1 JAN 2012] - 5" x 5.5" b/w photo pmt [12 AUG 1992]
